






Enviro-Stories

Book writing program

Created for schools

Enviro-Stories allows teachers to address many subject areas within the curriculum; such as English, Science, Art, Humanities and Technology. It can also address the *Sustainability* and *Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Histories and Cultures* cross-curricular priorities.

The program provides a creative outlet for diverse abilities. Whether it is for gifted students, average students or those with special needs, Enviro-Stories can be easily adapted to suit everyone.





Connecting to Country

At PeeKdesigns, we believe that First Peoples' culture should be a priority in all Australian schools. We have worked in consultation with a number of communities on education and community engagement projects.

Working with local communities

We have had the privilege to work with Indigenous communities in New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, Northern Territory and Western Australia. This has been through either on-ground projects, such as weaving workshops and resource development, or via proxy with community involvement in our Enviro-Stories books.

In partnership

The cultural resources we create are undertaken in partnership with the Traditional Owners, Elders and educators of a region. We've been working closely with the NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service and various Aboriginal Co-Management Committees to create curriculum-aligned excursion packs for schools visiting areas of cultural significance. **Contact us to request a copy.**

Schools and community

We are available to support Indigenous communities creating resources about their culture and Country that engage their local community. This includes school education materials (for primary and secondary schools) that link cultural knowledge with Australian curriculum outcomes.

The resources created aren't always just for schools or in the classroom. We work with local communities to create materials that engage the general public to help them understand and respect traditional knowledge and culture.



We have worked with PeeKdesigns on three major projects - Sculptures in the Scrub and Sandstone Caves Education Packages and 'Winangaya Gunidjarr' booklet. Throughout the projects Kelly has been both professional and sensitive to the requirements of the resources as well as the community members and NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) staff involved. Kelly has built a rapport with our community and its people and has portrayed important information and messages through these valuable educational products. The education kits in particular will be a valuable resource for teachers and NPWS staff to use when conducting excursions and tours to these destinations. Combined efforts

We have worked with numerous natural resource management agencies, industry bodies and farm managers, including Cotton Research Development Corporation, Catchment Management Authorities, Local Land Services, Invasive Animals CRC, Office of Environment and Heritage and Landcare. Through our combined efforts, we have produced a range of resources about farm production, sustainability, the importance of soil and water on the farm, paddock-to-plate, irrigation and invasive species. These resources have been targeted at primary and secondary schools, as well as local farmers.

Recommended reading

A selection of Enviro-Stories farming books written by kids are listed as recommended classroom reading for agriculture units prepared by Primary Industries Education Foundation Australia, and some books are also listed on Scootle - the national digital learning repository for Australian teachers.

In the bush

At PeeKdesigns, we create education solutions that support biodiversity initiatives, including the conservation of threatened species.



Connection to nature

A love of everything in nature, and a strong connection to the Aussie bush, helps us create meaningful resources that are based on personal experiences.

Rare and unusual

We have a range of resources in our repertoire, particularly focussed around threatened species, their conservation and management.

PeeKdesigns was established with the creation of a *Bat Education Kit* for the Fraser Coast region in Queensland. Since then we have developed the *Southern Queensland Flying-fox Education Kit* that is aligned to the Australian Curriculum for grades 4-9, the website allaboutbats.org.au and *Flying-foxes of South-East Queensland* community awareness brochure. We are now developing a suite of education resources on bats for the Burnett Mary Regional Group.

Other threatened species resources we've created include interactive multi-touch books for iPads about the critically endangered **Corroboree Frog** and the vulnerable **Squirrel Glider**, as well as education kits about the corroboree frog, **Bush Stone-curlew** and the **Lord Howe Island Phasmid** (a prominent species in the Lord Howe Island Education Kit).



Technical content

Don't think that we're just about school education; we're also proficient in designing for technical publications as well as writing scientific content. Examples include the botanical reference book *Plants of the Gwydir Shire Part 1*, weeds of North West NSW glovebox guides and the *Toowoomba Regional Flying-fox Management Strategy*.

Trails and signs

Creating individual, easy-to-read trail maps and interpretive signs can add that little bit extra 'uniqueness' to your project.

We can provide advice on sign placement and content as well as create just what you and your readers need to be kept informed.

My time spent working with Kelly from PeeKdesigns on the Boonalla Education Package was a delight. In the water

At PeeKdesigns, we create education solutions that support aquatic initiatives, from the smallest water bugs to large marine mammals.



Freshwater systems

After spending many years conducting Waterwatch (water bug sampling and water quality testing) and catchment based activities with schools in northern NSW, we are knowledgeable in freshwater ecosystems and can create informative and interactive freshwater education products.

Marine systems

We have worked with the NSW Marine Parks Authority in creating six individual education packages for their marine parks. This led to working with the Lord Howe Island Board to create an education kit about the biodiversity of the island.

Through Enviro-Stories, we have worked with the Marine Mammal Foundation to create a book on the Burrunan dolphin. This partnership will develop in the future.

Love our Lakes

The Gippsland Lakes are the largest navigable lake system in Australia. On behalf of the Love our Lakes team we created an education package for primary schools about the lakes system. Students used the knowledge contained in these resources to participate in the Enviro-Stories program - writing and illustrating eighteen books about the Gippsland Lakes.

We facilitated the development of the website loveourlakes.net.au. The site is a repository of information about the Gippsland Lakes, the projects being undertaken in the region and to help provide insight into the importance of this Ramsar Wetland system and its catchment. We currently work with West Gippsland Catchment Management Authority to maintain this website.

Through the 'Love our Lakes' Enviro-Stories program, PeeKdesigns successfully delivered a comprehensive, innovative and engaging program that has meaning and relevance to the participating schools and students in primary schools throughout the region.

The keys to this success have been the ability to structure the program around our key messages and areas of interest and the curriculum needs of the schools. Through Peter and Kelly's skills and ability to fully engage the partner schools, the program has been very well-received, efficiently implemented and has raised the profile of the Gippsland Lakes.
